An embodiment of majestic beauty and eternal grace, the vast expanse of Gir National Park is celebrated for its naturally preserved ecosystem and lavish reserves of flora and fauna. Situated near Talala Gir in Gujarat, this hilly terrain is also the final abode of the magnificent Asiatic Lions in the world.

The silenced roar of the fierce Asiatic lion

Asiatic lions faced threats from poachers and habitat fragmentation, and the population of these endangered species hit a record low. In 2000, this species was given the tag of ‘Critically Endangered’, which meant that they were just a step away from extinction.

The magnificent beast roared back to its glory

But since then, the Gujarat government imposed a strict ban on hunting. The remaining Asiatic lions were conserved, and their population eventually increased, bringing them out of the ‘Critically Endangered’ zone. As of 2020, the population of Asiatic lions in and around Gir National Park is estimated to be around 600, where they reside harmoniously in the protected areas of this enormous space.

Watch out for

Asiatic lions walk on their tiptoes without their heels touching the ground. While the male members move around in groups, known as ‘Pride’, only the female members hunt for prey.



Things to remember

- A single safari ride is of 03 hours
- The jeep driver and guide are trained and authorised by the Forest Department
- It is mandatory to be accompanied by a registered guide while on a safari
- Safari booking remains suspended from 16th June to 15th October due to weather conditions
- On-the-spot safari booking is not possible
